
School of Languages & Literature Organises a Book Release Function

SMVDU, Excise Dept. Organizes Heritage Walk to Babore Temples



The Excise Department Jammu, in collaboration with Shri Mata Vaishno Devi University (SMVDU), organized a Heritage Walk to Babore temples at Manwal, the ancient capital of the Dogra region. The event was flagged off by Prof. RK Sinha, Vice Chancellor SMVDU, and Rajiv Magotra, Principal of the Excise and Taxation Training Institute. The walk covered five temple sites spread over one kilometer and witnessed an enthusiastic gathering of historians, academicians, artists, and students. During the walk, the participants were made aware of the prominent historical, architectural, and cultural aspects of the Babore temples, which are being maintained by the Archaeological Survey of India (ASI). These temples reflect the zenith of Nagara temple building movement in North India. In his address, heritage expert Ashok Sharma briefed everyone about the historic essence and architectural grandeur of the temples, namely, Devi Bhagwati Temple, Dera Babore, Kala Dera One and Two, and Dera Temple. He emphasized the need for preserving and protecting the ancient heritage of the Jammu region, which has a unique place in the Indian Sub-Continent. Rupali Vaid, ETO Udhampur-Reasi Range, stressed the need for preserving the cultural heritage of the Jammu region, while Nagendra Singh Jamwal, Registrar SMVDU, emphasized the need for organizing more such events and giving more exposure to students to the rich culture and heritage of the Jammu region. JKST&IC Sponsored Brainstorming on Still birth, Infant Mortality and Birth Defects held at SMVDU

A one-day brainstorming meeting on "Stillbirth, Congenital Malformations, and Infant Death among

Newborns in the Jammu and Kashmir Region" was held at Shri Mata Vaishno Devi University (SMVDU), Katra, in collaboration with the J&K Science Technology and Innovation Council, Dept. of Science and Technology, Govt. of J&K. The meeting was organized by the team of ICMR-CAR scientists and scholars led by Dr. Girish, Dr. Sonali, Ms. Minerva, Mr. Rajeshwar, and Dr. Rakesh Kumar, the organizing secretary and principal coordinator of ICMR-CAR, SMVDU. The purpose of the meeting was to address the crucial is-



sues related to stillbirth, congenital malformations, and infant deaths. Padma Shri Prof. RNK Bamezai, former Vice-Chancellor of SMVDU and Ex-Dean Life Sciences JNU, chaired the meeting, and representatives from various institutes in the UT of Jammu and Kashmir attended. During the meeting, experts shed light on different aspects of stillbirth and congenital anomalies prevalent in Jammu and Kashmir. Prof. Bamezai suggested identifying biomarkers for stillbirth, congenital malformations, and infant deaths. Representatives from various institutes in the UT of Jammu and Kashmir, including Mrs. Sunita Razdan Dhar, Joint Director JKST&IC, Prof. Ghansham Saini, Head of Department of Paediatrics, GMC Jammu, Dr. Rakesh Raina PHC, Akhnoor, Dr. Dinesh Kumar, Dean Academics, AIIMS Jammu, Dr. Audesh Bhat, Central University of Jammu, Dr. Javeed Iqbal Department of Pediatric Respiratory Medicine (ERS) SKIMS, Dr. Renu Sharma, Dr. Ritesh Kumar from AIIMS Jammu, Dr. Anand Yelne Consultant Pediatrician, Dr. Sonia Nagyal Consultant Pathologist, Dr. Arunima Consultant Gynae, Dr. Kamaljeet Kaur, Consultant Paediatrician of SMVDNH, Katra, Dr. Anindya Goswami and Dr. Mohd. Jamal Dar Principal Scientists of CSIR-IIIM, Jammu, Mrs. Pushpa Oraon Associate Professor SMVDCON, Katra, Dr. Ruchi Shah from the University of Kashmir, and Dr. Ekta Rai from SMVDU, shared their insights. He noted the challenge of doing justice to their literary works and lauded the efforts of the late Kavi Rattan in laying the foundation for the serious drama movement in Jammu and Kashmir. Many prominent theatre personalities were present at the event. On the inaugural day, the Viraj Kala Kendra theatre group performed the Shah-Shahni Dogri drama, captivating the audience. Other plays scheduled for the festival included Pagla Ghoda (Hindi) by Young Hill Thespians, Bali and Shambu (Hindi) by Bhartiya Kala Sangam, Teeth (Nukkad-Dogri) by Rangyug, and Ashad K aek Din (Hindi). Dr. Rakesh, Chairman BCA, informed about the activities to be carried out during the theatre festival. Dr. Kamni, Vice Chairman Board of Cultural Activities (BCA), in her welcome address, gave a brief overview of the different phases of theatre in SMVDU and urged everyone to contribute towards making the festival a success.

Badal Sarkar's Modern Classic Play 'Pagla Ghoda' Staged at Matrika Auditorium, SMVDU



On the second day of the ongoing Festival of Plays organized by Shri Mata Vaishno Devi University Katra, the Hill Thespians presented a captivating performance of Pratibha Agarwal's Hindi translation of Badal Sarkar's renowned Bengali play "Pagla Ghoda" at the Matrika Auditorium. Written in 1967, the play deals with women's issues and highlights their subjugation in the patriarchy-entrenched Indian social system and its effects on both men and women. The play employs surrealistic elements and begins in a cremation ground at night, where four men are waiting for the incineration of a young woman who has committed suicide. To pass the time, they play cards and drink liquor. The spirit of the young, nameless girl on the pyre prompts the men to share their stories, and they narrate their love stories, revealing their guilt in sacrificing their love instead of taking a risk in fear of social disapproval. Directed and designed by young Sunil Sharma, the play was an engaging presentation by five amateur actors who were able to navigate between the intense layers, subplots, and intertwining backstories of all five characters. Sunaina Kumari slipped effortlessly into multiple roles of Malti, Mili, Laxmi, and Ladki, using perfect timing of intermittent dialogues and free-flowing on-stage movements that knitted the narration together. She successfully modulated her sonorous voice and changed the colors of her dupattas to render individuality to all four female characters. Sunil Sharma played Satu, Javed Gill played Kartik, Neeraj Sethi played Shashi, and Shubham Rajput played Heemadari. The production design was marked by wellthought-out and executed blocking, movements, and physical behavior. The music and light design added emotional intensity to the scenes. The performance was witnessed by a large audience, including Prof. RK Sinha, the Vice Chancellor, Sh. Nagendra Singh Jamwal, JKAS Registrar, Sh. Neeraj Gupta, JKAS Finance Officer, deans, directors, faculty, staff, and a significant number of students.

On Third Day of Theatre Fest, Bali and Shambhu Staged at Matrika in SMVDU

On Wednesday, the third day of the ongoing Theatre Festival, the play Bali and Shambhu was staged at the Matrika Auditorium. The play was presented by the Bhartiya Kala Sangam as a part of the ongoing "Trikuta Natya Ustav". Written by Manav Kaul, a Baramula-born-Mumbai-based writer/actor, and di-

rected by Mohit Mehra, the Hindi play 'Bali and Shambhu' tells the story of two senior inmates of an old age ashram. Shambu, who is grumpy and irritable, does not like sharing a room with Bali, who is extroverted and young at heart. However, he eventually comes around to accommodate him. Shambu is bad-tempered because of his traumatized memory of his daughter Titli, who haunts him as a spirit. Bali, on the other hand, is forced to take refuge in the old age home because his family does not want him with them. After a series of conflicts, the



two diametrically opposite characters eventually become one. Sandeep Verma played the role of 'Shambhu', the cantankerous old man, and Vivek Sangotra played the role of boisterous 'Bali'. The chemistry between the two, who also show mischievous sides, brought alive a simple tale with a lot of heart. The perfect timing of both actors, along with small gestures and movements, created moments of subtle pathos as well as humor on stage. Swinging from one emotion to another, the play steered away from becoming excessively sentimental. The set design was simple, with two diagonally placed cots in the foreground. The freeze frame and synchronization between the change of lights with the change of scenes and controlled background music added to the overall quality of the performance, which slowly and steadily evolved as a well-orchestrated melody. Kajal Bhagat played the role of 'Titli', Bobby Thakur played Gautam, Seeta played Jhilmil, and Ayaan played Shubankar. All of them did a commendable job. The backstage team included Aditya Bharati for lights, Tavleen Kaur for costumes, Ankit Sharma for music, Lakshmi Sharma for makeup, and Rajat Kholi/ Aditya Sharma for set design. Sh. Arvinder Aman, an additional secretary and retired JKAACL Jammu, was the guest of honor at the program. Present at the event were Prof. RK Sinha, Vice Chancellor, Sh. Nagendra Singh Jamwal, JKAS Registrar, Sh. Neeraj Gupta, JKAS Finance Officer, deans, directors, faculty, staff, and a large number of students. Overall, the play was an immersive performance that was savored by the audience.

On Fourth Day of Theatre Festival 'Trikuta-Natya-Utsav', a Nukkad Natak in Dogri 'Dheeth' was staged at SMVDU

The play, staged by Rangyug, was witnessed by Vice Chancellor, Prof. R.K Sinha, Registrar Nagendra

Singh Jamwal, faculty, staff, and students of SMVDU. In his address, Prof. Sinha emphasized the importance of such festivals. The play depicted the journey of a Saint and his disciple towards 'Indralok'. On their way, they reached the holy city of Jammu, where the Saint decided to descend. First, they wanted to take a dip in the sacred Tawi River, but upon finding the water polluted, they avoided it. They then proceeded towards the Jambwant Cave, which was all covered by a long row of shops selling junk food and other eata-



bles. They encountered a group of people weeping bitterly over the death of a friend who had apparently died from drinking yoghurt kept in a recycled polythene bag for about a week. The funeral procession was stuck in a lane that had shrunk to less than two feet due to illegal and unauthorized encroachments on both sides. In disgust, the Sadhus decided to fly away.

`Ashadh-Ka-Ek-Din' Staged during Theatre Fest ``Trikuta-Natya-Utsav'' at SMVDU

Mohan Rakesh's "Ashadh ka ek Din" is considered to be the first modern Hindi play. It was staged on the concluding day of the "Trikuta Natya Utsav" Festival of Plays, organized by Shri Mata Vaishno Devi Uni-

versity, at Matrika Auditorium today. "The Performers" presented the Hindi drama, directed by Vijay Goswami, which revolves around Kalidas and the muse Mallika, whom he abandons in his quest for fame and recognition, leading to his disillusionment. The play is divided into three acts. The first act portrays the pleasant union of Mallika and Kalidasa, where she merges her identity with him and craves to settle down with her family. In the second act, Kalidasa leaves his Himalayan village for Ujjaini to attain the status of a good poet and become involved in stately affairs. In the concluding act, he comes back to Mallika and realizes his mistakes. At the end of the drama, he desires to marry Mallika but cannot fulfill it. Considered an actor's paradise and their litmus test, today's performance saw competent performances by amateur actors who, driven only by their passion for theatre and without any pedagogical support, have been the backbone of the drama movement in Jammu. Nisha as Mallika impressed with her portraval of a love-smitten damsel who encourages her lover to leave in search of greater things only to put herself in hardship for the rest of her life. Neha Lahotra exhibited her acting skills in enacting the role of Ambika, Malika's aging mother, on a journey from maturity to a state of withering. ManojBhat, as Kalidas, with steady dialogue delivery and measured movements, was striking in the role of a genius who ultimately realizes his folly of being self-centered. Vijay Goswami, as Vilom, who later sires a daughter with Malika, did bring out the feud between the two poets. In the concluding scene, he seemed to steal the



show upon the off-keyed Kalidas. Other members of the cast who also gave good performances were Tapeshwar Dutta as Matul, Ravinder Manhas as Dantul, Ashish Sharma as Nikshep, Karishma as Rangini, Saugandhi as Sangini, Ridhim as Priyangumanjari, Pradeep Sharma as Anuswar, and Gaurav Sharma as Anunasik. The special effect of the cry of the infant was perfectly timed. However, the background score, especially the rendition of the raga, could have been more effective in the "jor" rather than in "drut." Dogri writer and Padma Shree awardee Sh. Mohan Singh was the chief guest of the program, and Smt. Shashi Rattan and Sh. Lalit Gupta were the guests of honor. Sh. Nagendra Singh Jamwal, JKAS Registrar, deans, directors, faculty, staff, and a large number of students witnessed today's play. Dr. Rakesh and Dr. Kamni from the Board of Cultural Activities (BCA) appreciated the theme of the play. The Theatre festival was dedicated to the memory of Late Kavi Rattan, a noted theatre personality and the first graduate from National School of Drama from the Jammu region.

Two-Day International Conference Begins at SMVDU



The School of Languages and Literature at Shri Mata Vaishno Devi University organized a two-day international conference on "Precarious Lives, Vulnerability, and Violence in Indian Public Sphere" on March 16-17. The event was attended by renowned scholars, academics, and students. The inaugural session was initiated with an introductory speech by Dr. Isha Malhotra, Head of the School of Languages and Literature, SMVDU. Dr. Malhotra emphasized the conference's objective to examine the interface between literature and language within the critical framework of precarity beyond the parameters of insecurity and vulnerability in the Indian public sphere. The welcome address was delivered by Prof. V. K. Bhat, Dean FOHSS, who elaborated that addressing precarity requires a comprehensive approach that considers the political, economic, and social factors that contribute to various vulnerable conditions, as well as the perspectives and experiences of those who are most affected by them. Sh. Nagendra Singh Jamwal (JKAS), Registrar, SMVDU, informed the participants about the university's successful efforts in organizing such scholastic events and their relevance in propagating academic discourse. Padma Shree Prof. RK Sinha, Vice-Chancellor, formally inaugurated the conference as the chief guest. He emphasized the importance of such relevant themes in contemporary times and highlighted how "Precarity" has emerged as a central concern in scholarly research due to political mobilizations against unemployment and social exclusion. The keynote address was delivered by Dr. Kanika Batra, Professor, and Director of Graduate Studies at Texas Tech University, on the topic "Precarity and Transgender Vulnerability: Bombay Dost and the Limits of Queer Intersectionality," who beautifully connected precariousness with the transgender community. The conference's topic was crucial since vulnerability can impact us all through our lives inevitably in many forms. Distinguished plenary speakers, including Dr. Om Prakash Dwivedi from the School of Liberal Arts at Bennett University, presented on "The Many Frames of Precarity." Dr. Anurag Kumar, the convener of the two-day international conference, proposed a formal vote of thanks. The research scholars, Ms. Devika Sharma and Ms. Eva Sharma, from the School of Languages and Literature, conducted the proceedings.



INTACH Organises Heritage Volunteer Trg Workshop

School of Biotechnology, SMVDU Celebrates World Water Day at Mansar



Mansar Lake, a world renowned Ramsar Site is home to aquatic and avian bio diversity. World Water Day is celebrated each year to raise awareness about the precious water and inspire action to tackle the water scarcity and resultant environment crisis. The event focuses on raising awareness and taking action to tackle the global water crisis faced by a billions of people living without access to water for drinking, irrigation and livelihoods. The event started with the keynote lecture by Prof. Ravindra Kumar Sinha Padamshree and Vice Chancellor of SMVDU. Prof Sinha emphasized the need for taking firm steps to stop water pollution including setting up of Sewage treatment plants for urban areas and effluent treatment plants for industrial units. " Our holy rivers and lakes are under severe pressure due to effluents, heavy metals, micro plastic and sewage and we need to mitigate the ill effects of water pollution" he said. He spoke at length about the cultural, religious and spritual significance of Mansar and its importance in providing drinking water, micro irrigation, nutrient exchange, recharging of aquifers and biodiversity preservation. " we need to have Lake Management plan for Surinsar and Mansar lakes so as to have sustainable eco- friendly tourism. Head School of Biotechnology, Dr.Ratna Chandra highlighted the importance of sacred water bodies like Surinsar - Mansar lakes in sustaining livelihoods and educating students about environment. She stressed the need for more such field visits to aware the students. Kirpal Singh, Heritage expert spoke about the importance of water bodies in Jammu region and their significance in Dogra culture. " Our bawlis, Step wells, sacred river sites (Bheds), Springs (Nags), Naga temples, folklore, legends and traditions are closely associated with Dogras respect for water bodies " he said. The program started with the welcome address by the coordinator of the event Dr.ShafaqRasool, faculty member, SoBT. Nagendra Singh Jamwal JKAS, Registrar SMVDU also interacted with the students emphasized the need for eco tourism and making local stakeholders aware and responsible about preserving the water bodies.Dr. Ratna Chandra, Head SoBT, emphasised the need for raising awareness regarding the critical issues of depleting ground water, rampant consumerism, Wheat - Paddy cycle and excessive use of chemicals in agriculture to bring positive change. SMVDU Faculty Presents Paper on Materials, Design and Manufacturing

Prof.Eswaramoorthy Muthusamy, a faculty member of Mechanical Engineering at SMVDU, presented a technical paper and chaired a session at the 2nd International Conference on Materials, Design, and

Manufacturing (ICMDM 2023) held at Anna University Chennai from February 23rd to 25th, 2022. The inaugural address was given by Prof. R Velraj, Vice-Chancellor of Anna University. The technical paper presented by Prof. Muthusamy was titled "A Comparative Study on Optical and Thermal Performance of Parabolic Trough Concentrator Using a Bundle of Absorber Tubes," in which he emphasized the importance of using a bundle of absorber tubes to achieve higher thermal and optical performance of parabolic trough collectors compared to using single absorber tubes. Other invited speakers from top-ranking institutes in India and abroad presented talks on ongoing research topics, and many external participants presented their research work via offline mode. Prof.



Muthusamy also chaired the session on "Newer Product Development" stream along with Dr.Balakrishnan, Engineering Manager at Caterpillar. The Department of Mechanical Engineering at Anna University Chennai organized the conference.

First Genetics Study of AI Scoliosis Presented at Banaras Hindu University

Researchers from the School of Biotechnology at Shri Mata Vaishno Devi University, Mr. Hemender Singh and Dr. Swarkar Sharma, recently participated in the 23rd Annual Convention of ADNAT and International Conference on Precision Medicine held at Banaras Hindu University, Varanasi from March 10th to 13th, 2023. The conference brought together 310 delegates from 17 states in India and 20 in-

ternational speakers from 13 countries, featuring a total of 40 invited lectures and 70 poster presentations of high quality. Mr. Hemender Singh presented his Ph.D. research work conducted under the guidance of Dr.Swarkar Sharma and Dr.Ekta Rai at SMVDU. His research, which is the first-ever genetic study of Adolescent Idiopathic Scoliosis (a spinal disorder) in India, showed an association between developmental and bone morphogenetic pathway genes and Adolescent Idiopathic Scoliosis



pathogenesis. Based on his work, Mr. Hemender was selected as a candidate for the prestigious Dr. PM Bhargava Award for the conference and won the first prize in the poster presentation. During the conference, Dr.Swarkar Sharma delivered an invited talk on precision medicine and the extensive work of the Human Genetics Research Group (HGRG) in the population of Jammu and Kashmir. In his talk, Dr. Sharma emphasized the gaps in genetic studies in Jammu and Kashmir due to limited resources and trained manpower in the region. He shared the research designs developed by HGRG to overcome these challenges and facilitate genetics research with the objective of precision medicine in the region. Dr. Sharma also presented an online open-access database, <u>www.jkdna.in</u>, created by the group for the use of researchers, scientists, and clinicians worldwide, to utilize human genomics data for healthcare research and the benefits of humankind.

SMVDU Faculty Bags Best Paper Award
