Ar.J.K.Gupta suggested that Schools should identify and explore such agencies / institutions / corporate, which not only fortify them with flow of latest information in their respective academic disciplines, but also augment their infrastructure and support them financially. He said that the option of signing an MoU with CII, in this direction could be explored.

He informed the house that this report shall first be debated internally among the Deans and Directors of the University, and then tabled before the Council in its next meeting.

He then directed Dr. Vandhana Sharma, to prepare an approach paper on the study of comparative regional languages & literature of J&K State including Dogri, so that the same can be discussed with Prof. Vinayshil Gautam when he visits the University.

The Vice Chancellor informed the Council that the University is in the process of constituting an ethics Committee to screen research proposals involving human and biological research. He also added that Prof. Verma and Dr. Vipan Kakkar have been asked to frame IPR rules for SMVDU. The members were of the view that the University should be allowed to engage the services of an advocate who specializes in IPR and Patent related issues and advises the University periodically on the same.

  - 1. Absence of permanence and Job Security

The Council noted the information. Ar.J.K.gupta suggested that the University should make it mandatory for all Schools to hold at least one National Conference / Seminar every year. He added that one International Conference / Seminar should be conducted every year in the University, and its proceedings should be published. The idea was welcomed by the Vice Chancellor who opined that this would greatly increase the visibility of the University.

#### 15.4.10 Minutes of meetings of Deans and Directors.

- 3.19 The Council noted the information. Hon'ble Vice Chancellor opined that by way of taking most of the decisions through Deans and Director's meeting the University has earmarked on the path of democratic decision making.
  - 15.4.11 Adjustment of Fee paid by Undergraduate Engineering Students to Central Counseling Board at the time of Central Counseling against the Fee to be paid by these students at SMVDU at the time of admission.

- Hon'ble Vice Chancellor acknowledged the efforts put in by the School of Biotechnology which has been successful in getting UGC funding under SAP. He said that this is the 1<sup>st</sup> SAP programme within the University. He also informed the members that all Schools which have minimum of 06 faculty members can apply for funding for various projects to UGC. The Vice Chancellor further advised the School of Biotechnology to spend money sensibly and involve all faculty members of the School in the above said programme and submit timely progress reports to the UGC through the University.
- 3.23 Ar. J.K. Gupta remarked that the University should explore the idea of launching summer

programmes on interdisciplinary topics like Energy Efficiency, Renewable Energy Resources etc. His idea was welcomed by the Vice Chancellor who also opined that this would not only charge our faculty and students with new knowledge but also facilitate outside students to come and study on the Campus. He said that he has already asked School of Innovation and Community Development to integrate and coordinate the activities of different schools and design such programmes, which could be offered during summer months.

# Item No.15.9 Granting Of Extra Time @ 20 Minutes Per Hour To The Disabled Students.

The Academic Council considered and approved the recommendations of the NHRC, Govt. of India and 3.40 Higher Education Department, Govt. of J&K, to implement the benefit of granting of extra time @ 20 minutes per hour to the disabled students in the SMVD University.

### Item No.15.10 Proposal for an amendment in the rules governing SMMSS.

The Academic Council considered and recommended to the Executive Council for approval the 3.41 following amendments in the rules governing SMMSS;

- Newly admitted students of MBA & MBA (BE) program, who secure a minimum of 75 percentile in their CAT Exams shall be eligible for the benefit of SMMSS in their 1st Semester.
- Newly admitted students of B.Tech program, who secure a minimum AIR of 30000 in AIEEE and B.Arch students, who secure a minimum AIR [Architecture] of 1000 in AIEEE shall only be eligible for the benefit of SMMSS in their 1st Semester.
- 3. All other students admitted to PG courses other than MBA & MBA (BE), shall not be eligible for the benefit of SMMSS in their 1st Semester.
- All continuing students [UG/PG] shall have to secure a minimum CGPA of 8.50 in the preceding semester to become eligible for the award of scholarship under SMMSS scheme for all subsequent semesters.
- 5. The SMMSS Committee has recommended that the word 'merit' in the scheme explicitly employs that the student should be extraordinary in his/her batch without failing any subject, credit as well as non-credit. Thus for becoming eligible for assistantship under SMMSS, the awardees shall have to maintain highest cumulative grade point average (CGPA) besides no loss of the registered credits to receive the benefits of the scheme on a continuous basis.
- 3.42 The Academic Council also considered and recommended to the Executive Council for approval of the recommendations of the SMMSS Monitoring Committee that an upper limit on family gross annual income of Rs 2,00,000.00 (Two Lacs only) be taken into consideration for a student to be considered for hailing from 'Poor Background' and having CGPA of 9.00 and above, for full tuition fee waiver. However, such applicants shall have to provide sufficient proof of their monthly income as on date, so as to ascertain their eligibility under the above scheme.

# <u>Proposal for devising a policy for sponsoring students to various cultural / academic events within India and Abroad</u>

- 3.43 The Council discussed the matter in detail and approved the following;
  - 1. Students may be allowed to officially attend / participate in events within the country, organized by UGC/AICTE/MHRD/GOI approved institutes / colleges / universities.
  - Such students may be reimbursed Travel expenses incurred on traveling by non-AC bus or 2<sup>nd</sup> class rail travel only.
  - 3. Such facility shall be limited to regular students only.
  - 4. Registration Fee / Boarding lodging expenses shall be reimbursed subject to availability of funds.
  - 5. Such requests should be submitted through the respective Directors and Deans at least 10 days in advance, duly outlining the aims and objectives of such event and reason for participation, proof of official invitation, brief tour plan, details of participation in events, and accompanying faculty, if any. In case of group participation where girls are present, they must be accompanied by a female teacher.
  - On return the students shall submit a brief report and outcome of their visit for perusal of the Competent Authority.
- 3.44 The Council further recommended that the University should earmark an amount for faculty members as well as students for a given year in which they can attend conferences/workshops/training programmes/competitions etc. The Council was of the view that the university should fix separate budget (for faculty and students) for the same.
- 3.45 Prof. J.K.Gupta informed the august house that IIT earmarks Rs. 1,00,000/- for each faculty members for a period of 2/3 years which they can use for participation in National/international Seminars/Conferences, buying books/computers/printers etc. He also informed the house that the faculty members have to give account statement after utilizing the amount.
- 3.46 He stressed that criteria should be fixed for faculty and students for release of funds in their favour. He

also stressed that faculty member who goes for national/International Seminars/Conferences on return should give the same presentation in front of all students and faculty members of his/her school so that they can learn from his/her experience.

# Item No.15.12 Proposal for giving a mercy chance to students who have failed to complete their respective Degrees within the stipulated time period.

- 3.47 The matter was deliberated by the Council in detail.
- 3.48 Ar. J.K.Gupta informed the council that in most of the institutes the duration for completion of degree is almost double the course duration but in our university it is very less. He recommended that the University should give mercy chance to students for completing their degree.
- 3.49 The Council agreed to the recommendations of Ar. J.K.Gupta but stressed that mercy chance should be given to deserving candidates only under exceptional circumstances after taking the approval of the Vice Chancellor.
- 3.50 The Council recommended that Mercy chance, for one academic year, should be given to only those candidates who have genuine cases and not to all the students who apply for it on the recommendation of the Director of the School & Dean of the College, and subsequent approval of the Hon'ble Vice Chancellor.
- 3.51 It also recommended that Executive Council may consider & approve the mercy chance in favour of Mr. Nirantar Kumar 2005ECS13, Mr. Prashant Kumar 2005ECS6 and Miss Moksha Dogra 2008EEM03.
- 3.52 The Council recommended that period of withdrawal should not be counted towards the maximum period allowed for completion of a particular course.

# Item No.15.13 Amendments in the provisions governing residence of students and their discipline, etc., in the Hostel Residents Guide Book.

3.53 The Council recommended the amendments in the Hostel Residents Guide Book, to the Executive Council for its approval.

# Item No.15.14 Amendment in the Ordinances governing Ph.D. Programme in SMVDU

3.54 The council recommended that the soft copy of the above rules should be sent to all external members for further comments before recommending the same to the Executive Council for its approval.

# <u>Item No.15.15</u> Adoption of rules governing Continuation of Admission, Evaluation & Prevention of use of Unfair Means in SMVDU

3.55 The Council recommended the rules governing Continuation of Admission, Evaluation & Prevention of use of Unfair Means in SMVDU, to the Executive Council for its approval. The same shall be applicable from 2010 batch onwards.

### Item No.15.16 Proposal to sign a fresh MoU with IIIM-Jammu fro twining the two institutions

3.56 The Council recommended the proposal to the Executive Council for its approval.

Item No. 15.17 Minutes of the Third & Fourth meeting of the Board of Studies of School of Computer Science & Engineering.

3.57 The Council approved the minutes of the Third & Fourth meeting of the Board of Studies of School of Computer Science & Engineering held on 27<sup>th</sup> April 2011 & 28<sup>th</sup> Sept 2011.

# <u>Item No. 15.18</u> <u>Minutes of the meeting of the Board of Studies of School of Business and School of Business Economics, COM.</u>

- 3.58 The Council deliberated and approved the minutes of the Meetings of the Board of Studies of School of Business and School of Business Economics, COM held on 4/02/11 & 27/09/11.
- 3.59 The Council further recommended the following for the approval of the Executive Council
  - 1. Closure of the MBA(BE) course from session 2012-13 onwards and MBA course with two sections of 45 strength each should run under School of Business, COM. Thus MBA intake shall be 90.
  - 2. Starting of MBA (Executive) programme from the Academic Session 2012-13 with the rider that the eligibility criteria regarding experience should be reduced from 5 years.
  - 3. To give credence to the members of ICAI/ICWAI/AI/ICSI by approving it as equivalent to MBA program to enroll for Ph.D. programme in Management under the College of Management, SMVDU.
  - 4. Extension for another six months for submission of thesis in favour of Ms. Shallu Sehgal, Research Scholar in School of Business Economics.

# Item No. 15.19 Minutes of the meeting of the Board of Studies of School of Architecture & Landscape Design.

- 3.60 The Council deliberated on the Minutes of the Board of Studies of School of Architecture & Landscape Design. It authorized Ar.J.K.Gupta to peruse the minutes in detail and give his recommendations, if, any which would be acceptable to the Council.
- 3.61 Ar.J.K.Gupta has subsequently by email dated: 27<sup>th</sup> October 2011, recommended the following for approval of the Executive Council;
  - a) Credits
    - i. Students shall have to earn credits as defined in the Course of Study
    - ii. Students are required to maintain minimum CGPA of 5, as per requirements outlined in Course of Study.

#### b) Attendance

- i. 75% attendance in all subjects is mandatory for appearing in the MAJOR exams, including assignment based subjects (like Working Details, Art Thesis, Measured Drawing etc.).
- ii. Students not fulfilling the criteria shall not be permitted to take up the Major exam and shall be awarded F grade. The parents of the students falling short of stipulated attendance shall be informed and communicated in writing on regular intervals in order to avoid any controversy at later stage.
- iii. Students would also be required to have minimum 75% attendance in Special Lectures. Since the subject is attendance based, students shall be required to complete assignments for the missing attendance by staying on the campus rather than just registering and submitting assignments in lieu thereof.
- iv. Student remaining absent in Major Exam shall be awarded F grade in that particular subject.

# c) Weightage of Marks

### 1. Architectural Design

i. In the subject of Architectural design, repeated exams (Minor-I and II) break the continuity/rhythm of the Studio and class work and are counterproductive for the quality of work. Accordingly, therefore only Major exam shall be held. No Minor-I and II exam shall be

- held in the subject of Architectural Design.
- ii. The respective weightage of marks/grades shall be 40% for the Major and 60% for the internals in the subject of Architectural Design..
- iii. Evaluation for 60% internal marks shall be further sub-divided into 40% and 20%. 40% component shall be carried out by the course coordinator and two other faculty members appointed by the Director SALD. 20% component shall be evaluated by an External Expert (Architect). Evaluation in the subject shall be carried out for different stages as defined in the studio problem
- v. All internal evaluations shall be carried out before Major Exam and students shall be informed about their scores. Students shall be communicated submission dates in advance for different stages as part of the studio problem. Students failing in internal assessment shall not be permitted to appear in the Major Exam.
- vi. For objective evaluation of the studio problem, the External Expert shall be supplied with the copy of Studio problem and brief of the work carried out by them by the studio coordinator well before the scheduled external examination.
- vii. In order to promote better appreciation of the subject of Arch Design, it was decided that the formulation of Studio Problem for the subject Arch. Design shall be a major concern of Faculty Members. Problem shall be framed preferably in the local context keeping in view geographical and ecological aspects of the region in vicinity in order to ensure overall development of the area/region. The finalization of the design problem shall be completed in consultation with the HOD well before the commencement of the academic session and made available to the students
- \*Note: The subject of Interior Design shall also be governed by above conditions except no external Expert shall be invited for any assessment.

# 2. Other Subjects

- i. In case of Building Material and Construction (BMC) the pattern of distribution of marks shall be 40% for the exam (10:10:20) and 60% for the Internal assessment.
- ii. In the case of subjects of Art and Graphics (Arts- 40%, graphics-60%) and Architectural Drawing the Evaluation pattern shall be 40% marks for internal and 60% marks for exams (15:15:30).
- iii. Pattern of Evaluation/Exam for the subject of survey shall be 15:15:30 i.e.60% (Minor –I, Mil –II & Major), 40% for the assignment and field work.
- iv. All other subjects shall continue to have the distribution of marks as defined in the Courses of study i.e.50:20:20:10 (Major: Minor-II: Minor-II: Assignments).
- v. In case of Dissertation, the internal evaluation of 50 marks shall be on the pattern of 10:10:30 (total 50). Presentation by the student shall carry additional 50 marks. The evaluation of Dissertation (50 marks) report shall be completed before the start of Majors. Evaluation/presentation (50 marks) shall be carried out by a jury comprising of minimum of 2 faculty members other than the guide appointed by Director SALD.

# d) Working Details

- i. The subject of Working Details to be included as integral part of the course of studies in the Semester VIII considering its role and importance in the art and science of Architecture.
- The Council however, opined that all the above recommendations which would entail a change in the existing evaluation pattern, course structure / curriculum, etc., shall be applicable to students admitted from 2012 batch onwards.

# Item No. 15.20 Minutes of the meeting of the Board of Studies of Biotechnology

3.63 The Council deliberated and approved the minutes of the Meetings of the Board of Studies of School of Biotechnology held on 25/05/11.

# Item No. 15.21 Minutes of the meeting of the Board of Studies of Electronics and Communication Engineering

- 3.64 The Council deliberated on the minutes of the Meetings of the Board of Studies of School of Electronics and Communication Engineering held on 31<sup>st</sup> March 2011 & 10<sup>th</sup> Oct 2011 respectively and approved the same.
- 3.65 The Council further recommended that any change in the course content should have prospective and no retrospective effect.
- 3.66 Ar. J.K.Gupta stressed that every Board of Studies should try to not change its course structure every year. Courses should be allowed to run for 4-5 years and then a comprehensive review of the same should be taken before any change is recommended in that course.

# Item No. 15.22 Minutes of the meeting of the Board of Studies of Languages and Literature

3.67 The Council deliberated on the minutes of the Meetings of the Board of Studies of School of Languages and Literature held on 20<sup>th</sup> April 2011 and approved the same except the proposal of starting the certificate course in French.

# Item No. 15.23 Minutes of the meeting of the Board of Studies of Mechanical Engineering

- 3.68 The Council deliberated on the minutes of the Meetings of the Board of Studies of the School of Mechanical Engineering held on 05/10/11 and approved the introduction of new courses for research scholars in the School of Mechanical Engineering, as under;
  - a) EMEL XXXRS Engineering Tribology
  - b) EMEL XXXRS Design of Metal Matrix Composites
  - c) EMEL XXX RS Hybrid Energy System
  - d) EMEL X X X RS Product Design and Manufacturing Methodologies

Where XXX Denotes appropriate numeric number.

# Item No. 15.24 Minutes of the meeting of the Board of Studies of Mathematics

- 3.69 The Council approved the minutes of the Meetings of the Board of Studies of School of Mathematics held on 28<sup>th</sup> April. The Council approved the introduction of;
  - 1. New courses for Research Scholars registered with School of Mathematics;
    - a) Skew Polynomial Rings and their Applications
    - b) Sample Surveys
- 2. New elective course for M.Sc.[Mathematics] students, titled, "Biomathematics".

# Item No.15.25 Proposal to exempt the payment of Mess Fee to Sem VII students of B.Arch, who have to go for Practical Training / Professional Practice outside the Campus

3.70 The Council deliberated on the issue and recommended the same for approval of the Executive Council.

- <u>Item No.15.26</u> Fee concession in favour of wards of the Shrine Board employees in various courses offered by the SMVD University.
- 3.71 The Council was of the view that since the matter is a policy decision it should be decided by the Executive Council only.
- Item No.15.27 Additional panel of Expert nominees of the Academic Council for the various Selection

  Committees for recruitment of Faculty positions at SMVD University.
- 3.72 The Council considered and recommended the same for approval of the Executive Council.

## Item No.15.28 Request of additional faculty members in School of Computer Science & Engineering

3.73 The Council considered and recommended to the Executive Council sanction of two additional posts of Assistant Professor in Computer Science & Engineering in Pay Band of Rs. 15600-39100 with AGP of Rs.6000/- for the next Semester commencing January, 2012.

## Item No. 15.29 Creation of posts for School of Innovation & Community Development

3.74 The Council considered and recommended to the Executive Council the creation of two posts of the level of Lecturer/Assistant Professor having the relevant Academic background and experience in the relevant area be sanctioned in Pay Band of Rs. Rs. 15600-39100 with AGP of Rs.6000/-; besides one post of Junior Assistant in Pay Band of Rs. 5200-20200 with GP of Rs. 1900/- for assisting the concerned Director of the School in his day to day works pertaining to the functioning of the School.

# Item No.15.30 Creation of Non-Teaching positions in SMVDU

3.75 The Council considered and recommended to the Executive Council the creation of additional Non - Teaching positions of Network Administrator (in the Pay Band of Rs. 15600-39100 with Grade Pay of Rs. 5400/-), Network Technical Assistant (in the Pay Band of Rs. 9300-34800 with Grade Pay of Rs. 4200/-) and Architectural Assistant (in the Pay Band of Rs. 5200-20200 with Grade Pay of Rs. 2800/-) in the university.

### Item.No.15.31 Proposal for enhancement in the honorarium being paid to Visiting Faculty, Experts, etc.

- 3.76 The Council deliberated on the issued and recommended the enhancement of honorarium to be paid to the visiting faculty to the Executive Council, as detailed below;
  - 1. Visiting Faculty: Rs.1000/- per hour subject to a maximum of 2 hours per day [i.e. Rs.2000/], subject to a maximum of Rs.6000/-, for a three day schedule.
  - 2. Other Visiting Experts: Rs. 2000/- per day (on the recommendation of the Academic Council).
  - 3. Sitting Fee for Selection Committee Members: Rs.2000/- per day.
  - 4. Sitting Fee for AC / EC Experts: Rs.2000/- per day.

# Item No. 15.32 Proposal for annulment of School of Biochemistry and shifting of Faculty positions already approved for School of Biochemistry to School of Biology & Chemistry.

3.77 The Council recommended the same for approval of the Executive Council.

## Item No. 15.33 Proposal for offering Ph.D. programme in Chemistry by the School of Biology & Chemistry.

3.78 The Council deliberated on the issue and approved the proposal of offering Ph.D in Life Sciences and Chemistry independently and Chemical-Biology combined depending upon the research problem and

qualification of the supervisor.

# Item No. 15.34 Any Other Item with the permission of the Chair

- 15.34.1 Ratification of the tenure of Executive Council nominees in the Academic Council for the intervening period, i.e., Sept 2007 to August 2011.
- 3.79 The Council recommended to the Executive Council to ratify the tenure of Executive Council Nominees in the Academic Council of SMVDU, for this intervening period i.e., Sept 2007 to August 2011, so as to regulate their membership in the earlier Council
- 15.34.2 Modification in the Fee Refund Rules of the University.
- 3.80 The Council deliberated on the issue that the university should remain open ended regarding the date of closure of admission in the fee refund rules rather than fixing the same. It was then decided that the language of the 1<sup>st</sup> point of fee refund rules shall know be read as
  - 1) In case a student opts for withdrawal of admission before the first date of registration (as may be indicated in the academic calendar) but not later than the date of closure of admission 100% of the annual tuition fee shall be refunded after deducting Rs. 1,000/- as cancellation charges.
- 3.81 The Council recommended the above for approval to the Executive Council
