Hon'ble Vice Chancellor SMVD University accorded a warm introductory welcome to all the new External Members before the Academic Council. In a brief presentation, the Hon'ble Vice Chancellor highlighted the achievements of the University during the past one year and informed the house about the successful conduct of the 9th Convocation conducted by SMVD University on 28th Dec. 2023 and Rs.20 Crore grant received under 'Grant to Strengthen Universities' component of PM-USHA Scheme of Ministry of Education, GoI. It was also informed by the Hon'ble Vice Chancellor that In-Situ Promotion Policy for the non-teaching staff has already been implemented at SMVDU. The formal meeting of the Committee constituted to review and recommend the case of faculty/ staff for In-Situ Promotions shall be conducted twice a year.

	Resolution	The matter was discussed in detail and the Academic Council was apprised over the status of admission for the year 2022-23 whereby a substantial number of seats remained unfilled as had been earmarked for reserved categories (as per details provided at Agenda Item No. 36.32 to the Agenda), consequently leading to academic and financial loss to the University. It was resolved that for dealing with such a situation in future creation of

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		<p>provision of Supernumerary seats is essential for filling up these unfilled seats from the open category candidates when all the list of candidates applying for admission have already been exhausted and that there in no further scope of inviting any fresh applications for filling up of seats in reserved categories. The provision will enable the University to utilize the available infrastructure to its fullest particularly when the University is equipped with requisite infrastructure and available faculty for taking up the course in its full strength of intake. The legal implication to the proposal if any, shall be examined in consultation with Legal Counsel of the University by studying similar models as applicable in other Universities/ HEIs.</p> <p>Further, it was proposed by Prof. Sandeep Sancheti that the Guidelines of UGC for Supernumerary seats for International Students in Undergraduate and Postgraduate Programmes in Higher Educational Institutions in India shall also be taken into consideration.</p> <p>After detailed discussion on the matter, it was approved that a Committee shall be constituted to review the guidelines of UGC for Supernumerary seats for International Students in Undergraduate and Postgraduate Programmes in Higher Educational Institutions in India.</p> <p>The recommendations of the Committee shall be placed before the Executive Council for consideration and approval.</p>

Agenda Item No.36.02	<p>Proposed Course Structure for Four-year undergraduate Programmes (FYUP) to be offered by SMVDU from AY 2024-25 onwards as per UGC Guidelines in accordance with NEP 2020</p> <p>The undergraduate Programmes in the disciplines of Science, Humanities, and Management are currently being offered as Five-Year Integrated Programmes in the University from the Academic session 2022 as per UGC "Curriculum & Credit Framework" under NEP 2020.</p> <p>As approved by the Executive Council in its 34th meeting, the nomenclature of Five-Year Integrated Programmes in the disciplines of Science, Humanities, and Management is aligned in terms of guidelines of the UGC and is amalgamated into Four-year undergraduate Programmes (FYUP) from the Academic Session 2024-25 and onwards.</p> <p>Accordingly course structure for Four-year undergraduate Programmes (Annexure A2) has been prepared as per guidelines of NEP 2020 and is placed before the Academic Council for consideration and approval.</p>
Resolution	<p>After a detailed discussion on the subject matter, the Academic Council approved the implementation of proposed Course Structure for Four-year undergraduate Programmes (FYUP) to be offered by SMVDU from AY 2024-25 onwards as per UGC Guidelines in accordance with NEP 2020. (Refer Annexure A2)</p>
Agenda Item No.36.03	<p>Proposed Structure for B.Tech. Programs from AY 2023-24 onwards as per NEP 2020 Guidelines.</p> <p>As per decision taken in the 35th meeting of Academic Council, a Committee was constituted for the finalization of course structure for all B.Tech. programs as per NEP 2020 and in accordance with Model Curriculum of AICTE for B.Tech.</p> <p>Further, a course on "Entrepreneurship" under Ability Enhancement Courses and AI/ML under core course has been introduced in the fifth/sixth semester of all B. Tech programs. Mandatory Courses like Environmental Science and Education, Universal Human Values-II and Indian Knowledge System have been incorporated in the Model course structure of B.Tech. Programs. Course structure has been strictly prepared as per NEP 2020 guidelines with Multiple Entry and Exit options after 1st, 2nd and 3rd year.</p>



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	<p>The proposed course structure for B.Tech. programs (as per NEP 2020 guidelines) framed as per recommendations of the Committee is placed at Annexure A3</p> <p>A basket of Courses for VAC/SEC/AEC has also been prepared and offered to 1st Year students of B.Tech./B.Sc./B.A. in Sem-I and Sem-II. (Academic Session 2022-2023) is placed at Annexure A4.</p> <p>The proposed course structure for B.Tech. programs is placed before the Academic Council for consideration and approval.</p>
Resolution	<p>After a detailed discussion on the subject matter, the Academic Council approved the implementation of proposed course structure for B.Tech. programs (as per NEP 2020 guidelines) from AY 2023-24 and onwards.</p> <p>The basket of Courses for VAC/SEC/AEC also stands approved.</p> <p>It was however advised by Prof. Madhusudan Singh that the extra credits that a student needs to earn for Honors degree (Specialization within discipline) in B.Tech. Program and B.Tech. degree with Minor Specialization (Specialization from other Disciplines), may be allowed to earn those credits from 2nd Year onwards. The matter was discussed in the august house and stands approved.</p>
Agenda Item No.36.04	<p>Withdrawal of degree and issuance of revised / fresh degree certificate for recommendation of the Academic Council.</p> <p>Agenda item for withdrawal of degree of a student convicted by a court of law and issuance of revised / fresh degree was put up for approval of the Executive Council vide Item No. 34.18 in its 34th meeting held on 7th Nov 2023 based on the recommendations of the same by the Academic Council in 35th meeting. The Executive Council did not approve the agenda and directed that the University may examine the existing procedures in other Universities.</p> <p>After examining the procedures followed by other Universities in J&K UT, it has been observed that there is a provision for issuance of revised / fresh degree in case of an error or change in credentials of a student. Further, provision exists in the statutes of the University of Jammu for withdrawal of degree, diploma or certificate issued by the University, in case of conviction by a court of law for scandalous conduct or moral turpitude.</p> <p>In view of the above, agenda item regarding withdrawal of degree issued by the University, upon recommendation of the Academic Council, in case of conviction of a student by a court of law for an offence which, in the opinion of the Academic Council of the University, is a serious offence involving moral delinquency or upon the ground that he/she has been guilty of scandalous</p>



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conduct or involved in any anti-national activity and for issuance of revised / fresh degree where any error is reported in a Degree certificate having been issued to a pass-out student due to the reason of a typographical error, accidental skip, oversight or error resulting out of the software while framing the degree certificate in any of the fields that are set in the format in the Degree Certificate or a voluntary change in the particulars of a student / parents, the matter having been brought to the notice of the University Authorities, either by the student himself or any other source, is therefore being placed before the Academic Council for recommendations and for forwarding the same for consideration of approval of the Executive Council.

The provision for withdrawal of degree and issuance of revised/ fresh degree shall be dealt with in the following manner:

1. In the event of any error in the degree issued to a student where the matter is brought to the notice of the University Authorities either by student himself or any other source on ascertainment of the error at a later stage by the University, the University with the approval of Academic Council shall withdraw degree and issue a new one to the student after rectifying the error.
2. Where a student has provided documentary evidence reporting any change in the particulars of Name of self or the parentage of the student in his/her matriculation Diploma /Certificate issued by any Competent Authority (CBSE/State Board of the School Education) requests for re-issuance of the Degree Certificate issued by the University, the University with the approval of Academic Council may withdraw the Degree Certificate as issued and shall release fresh Degree Certificate incorporating therein the amendment as desired after verifying the genuity of the documents submitted in support of the claim.
3. Where the student has been convicted by a court of law for an offence which, in the opinion of the Academic Council of the University, is a serious offence involving moral delinquency or upon the ground that he/she has been guilty of scandalous conduct; involved in any anti-national activity and therefore upon recommendation of the Academic Council, the University may withdraw from any person any degree or certificate conferred or granted by the University with the approval of Competent Authority after giving an opportunity to the student of being heard. The Academic Council may recommend for withdrawal of a degree by a special resolution passed by a majority of not less than two-thirds of its members present and voting
4. Any other contingency requiring correction shall also be dealt with



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	<p>accordingly re-correcting any oversight, if it comes to the knowledge of the University.</p> <p><u>The mechanism to be followed for issuance of revised degree</u></p> <p>Consequent upon approval, the following mechanism may be adopted for issuance of the revised / fresh degree certificate:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none">1. Request received from the concerned student, through Head of the School and Dean of the concerned Faculty / request received from any other source which may require revision of the degree certificate will be examined by the Examination Wing and recommendation shall be made to the Competent Authority for approval.2. Upon accord of approval, Fresh degree shall be prepared and signed by the incumbent signatories.3. Fresh date of issuance, new serial number of the degree certificate, reason for withdrawal of the old degree certificate alongwith its serial number and a remark "REVISED" shall be mentioned at the back of the fresh degree certificate.4. In case of a voluntary and legal change in the name of the student or his / her parentage, to be verified from the fresh matriculation marks sheet / diploma issued by any Competent Authority (CBSE/State Board of the School Education), a fee of Rs. 7000/- shall be levied for issuance of revised degree certificate upon request of the student.5. Entry shall be made in the Scroll Register and the decision shall be tabled before the Academic Council for ratification. <p>The matter is placed before the Academic Council for consideration and approval.</p>

After implementation of Reservation Policy, SMVD University has recently initiated the process of direct recruitment to various faculty positions in different Schools at the level of Assistant Professor, Associate Professor & Professor and an advertisement notice No: SMVDU/Adm/Estt.-FA/Rect.Adv/1 of 2023/1252 dated: 14/09/2023 (inviting applications for various teaching positions for direct recruitment from the eligible, well qualified and experienced candidates to the post of Professor, Associate Professor and Assistant Professor at various Schools) (**Annexure-22**) was published at national level in news paper(s) with a detailed advertisement (providing for the qualifications and other conditions) was uploaded on the University Website. With a view to maintain utmost transparency and probity, it was decided that all the application(s) shall be received through the Samarth portal only (online mode) with a mandatory requirement of submitting the hardcopy by the candidates within prescribed date which in this case was kept as 31-10-2023.

While finalizing the above advertisement, rules of specific regulatory bodies were incorporated as per directions passed by the Executive Council at its 33rd meeting held on 7th June 2022 and as per Chapter-38 (Recruitment Procedures & Conditions of Service of University Employees, clause no 2, Qualifications for various categories of teaching posts provides) of University Statutes that clearly states "The rules of specific regulatory bodies shall be made applicable to specific disciplines, for all issues concerning direct recruitment, promotion under CAS and incentives for acquiring higher qualifications".

Accordingly AICTE 2018 regulations, UGC 2018 regulations and CoA 2020 norms, as amended from time to time, were followed for framing of above advertisement for various disciplines as per applicability.

For Engineering & Management Disciplines, AICTE norms were followed; for Architecture Disciplines, Council of Architecture norms and for Humanities, Sciences and Social Sciences, UGC norms were followed.

However, the University has set higher norms for maintaining the standards of education and research, as the above Regulations are the minimum standards.

In the above mentioned regulations as listed in the preceding para, only UGC 2018 regulation provides guidelines for short listing criteria at the level of Assistant Professor, however, AICTE & COA regulation are silent on this issue. At the level of Associate Professor and Professor the methodology for

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calculation of research score is provided in the UGC 2018 regulation, however, no such methodology is provided in AICTE 2019 and COA 2020 regulation. These regulations are also silent on methodology for overall selection process which was earlier available in UGC 2010 and AICTE 2012 regulations meaning thereby that the University shall be required to come up with such methodology for transparency and fair play. Thus a need has been felt for drafting rules with respect to short listing of candidates.

In order to refine the objective and credible methodology of the recruitment process and with the intent to insure the **objectivity probity, accountability and transparency**; an agenda item regarding shortlisting criteria to be adopted for recruitment to the post of Assistant Professor was placed before Executive Council in its 34th meeting (Agenda Item No. 34.30), whereby it was directed that *"After thorough deliberations on the matter, it was desired that a detailed examination of the processes adopted in conduct of written tests, short listing criteria must be undertaken, including study of the mechanisms adopted in other similar institutions. This was done with a view to ensure objectivity and fool proof conduct of written test, and to guard against any malpractices creeping into the system"*.

The procedure to be followed for selection of the candidates found eligible (as per Recruitment Rules of the Univeristy) after initial screening, for the posts of Assistant Professor, Associate Professors and Professors was drafted and was placed before all Deans, Head of the Schools, Faculty Incharge Examination, Director DQA, etc, in a meeting held on 11th Jan. 2024 under the Chairmanship of Hon'ble Vice Chancellor for deliberations (Minutes of the meeting placed at **Annexure A23**). The final draft of procedure, after incorporating changes as suggested by the aforesaid committee is detailed here under:

**GUIDELINES FOR RECRUITMENT TO THE POST OF ASSISTANT PROFESSOR,
ASSOCIATE PROFESSOR, AND PROFESSOR AT SMVDU**

1.Procedure for submission of application:

The candidates are required to fill up the online application form and also submit the hardcopy of the online application form along with the requisite/desired/relevant documents in support of their claim of eligibility along with prescribed fees. The last date of submission of online application along with the requisite fees shall be as may be specified by the University. The link of online application will be available on University website i.e. www.smvdu.ac.in on dates as may be specified for the purpose.



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In case the candidate wishes to apply for more than one discipline/ post, he/she shall be required to submit separate online application form(s) along with requisite fees as applicable for each post.

The hardcopy of the online application forms along with the proof of fee receipt must reach the O/o The Registrar, SMVDU within due date for submission of Hard copy as may be specified/ notified by the University for the purpose. However, if the candidate(s) have dispatched hard copy on the last date of submission and his online application with the submission was completed within the due date, University may permit late submission also, provided the scrutiny process has not been started till then.

2. Procedure for selection of candidates:

- A. The applications received will be scrutinized as per the eligibility criteria as prescribed by the University for respective disciplines.
- B. List of 'provisionally eligible' and 'not eligible' candidates shall be uploaded on the University website i.e. www.smvdu.ac.in.
- C. The University may conduct a screening test to limit the number of applicants to be called for post of Assistant Professor. The screening test for the post of Assistant Professor shall be based on the syllabus of NET for Non-Engineering Discipline/ GATE for Engineering Discipline including Architecture.
- D. The provisionally eligible candidates for the post of Assistant Professor shall be required to download admit cards and take hardcopy of the same for appearing in the screening test.
- E. The date of Screening Test shall be notified on the University website www.smvdu.ac.in. The candidates shall be required to obtain such information/updates from University website.
- F. Cut off criteria to be adopted for screening test for preparing of the merit list on the basis of written test for the candidates to qualify for presentation and interview:
 - I. Average of marks obtained by top five candidates may be taken as N. The cutoff marks for Unreserved, PSP, Social Class ALC/IB, EWS, Backward Area may be taken as 55 % of N and for SC/ST and PWD candidates cut off is 45% of N.

OR

- II. For Unreserved, PSP, Social Class ALC/IB, EWS, Backward Area candidates may be taken as 45 % of maximum marks and for



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SC/ST/PWD candidates may be taken as 40 % of the maximum marks.

G. Out of G (i) & G(ii), whichever is higher has to be taken as final cut off for qualifying screening test subject conditions defined at 4(b)

- The candidates shortlisted from the screening test shall qualify for next stage.
- For Associate Professor Screening shall be done by screening committee as per API Score reflected in application form after due verification of documents.

3.The following Procedure, will be followed by the University for shortlisting and selection of candidates for the posts of Assistant Professors, Associate Professors and Professors:

- a) **Step-I** : Written test for Assistant Professor for shortlisting of candidates for further recruitment process.
- b) **Step-II** : Shortlisting of candidates for the post of Associate Professor and Professor after due verification of API score claimed by candidate in application form (On Samarth API is calculated as per UGC regulations) The Candidates who have been shortlisted for further recruitment process shall be asked to submit 'Academic Record', and 'Experience & Research Performance' as per Table- I. The same shall be verified by a committee.
- Normally, 10 candidates for the first post and 05 candidates for each subsequent post of Assistant Professor and 08 candidates for the first post and 04 candidates for each subsequent post of Associate Professor and Professor shall be called for the interview. However, all the candidates having Ph.D. Degree shall be called for interview. The University shall have the right to restrict the number of candidates to a reasonable number to be called for interview.
- c) **Step- IV:** Seminar/ Presentation by the shortlisted/ declared eligible Candidates for interview.
- d) **Step-V:** Interview of the candidates. The weightage of final award sheet for selection of candidates shall be as follows:

4. NOTES:

Assessment of the candidates shall be based on the evidence produced by the applicant such as copy of the publications, sanction letters of the projects, certificates of utilization/completion of the projects (issued by the Institute/ University), acknowledgements and approval letters for patents granted, Ph.D. award letter/notification of research scholars guided, etc.

5. Composition of the Screening Committee:

All the applications of the candidates shortlisted/declared eligible, as the case may be, shall be scrutinized by a Committee, constituted by the Vice Chancellor, consisting of the following:

A senior faculty nominated by Vice Chancellor (Chairperson)

Six faculty members at the level of Professor/Associate Professor/ Assistant Professor from the University

The committee shall award/verify the points **Annexure A24** (A1, A2, A3) based on the criteria given in Table 1, claimed by candidates shortlisted/ declared eligible. The confidential report **Annexure A24** (B1, B2, B3), prepared and duly signed by all the members of the committee, shall be placed in a sealed cover and submit to the Vice Chancellor for necessary consideration at the time of interview of candidate.



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6. Seminar/ Presentation by the shortlisted/ declared eligible Candidates:

Before the interview, the University shall assess the teaching aptitude and ability of the candidate through seminar/ lecture using latest teaching aids.

A Presentation Assessment Committee, constituted by the Vice Chancellor, consisting of the following shall evaluate the teaching aptitude and ability of the candidate:

Dean of the Concerned faculty / Professor nominated by Vice Chancellor (Chairperson)

Head of the concerned Department/ Professor nominated by Vice Chancellor

Three Professors/ Associate Professor/ Assistant professor (as applicable) of the University

One external subject experts (if the external expert(s) are not available or do not turn up due to any reason, the Professor(s) from the University shall be nominated)

Quorum shall be of 4 (Four)

The shortlisted/declared eligible candidates shall be required to make a presentation before the Committee on a specified date and time as notified by the University on the University website www.smvdu.ac.in. This committee will grade, in the prescribed proforma **Annexure A24** (C1, C2, C3), all the candidates who make their presentations.

The confidential report **Annexure A24** (D1, D2, D3), prepared in the form of marks/points using the formula **Annexure A24** (E1, E2, E3) by each Presentation Assessment Committee Member separately and duly signed by the Member and Chairman of the Committee, shall be placed in a sealed cover and submitted to the Vice Chancellor for necessary consideration at the time of interview of the candidates.

7. The Selection Committee

The constitution of the Selection Committee shall be as provided in the SMVDU Statutes.

The selection committee shall consider the recommendations of the Screening Committee (50% for Assistant Professor and 60% for Associate Professor/Professor) and Presentation Assessment Committee (15% for Assistant Professor and 10% for Associate Professor/Professor) and also assess the candidates' domain knowledge (15% for Assistant Professor and 10% for Associate Professor/Professor) and interview performance (20% for Assistant Professor/Associate Professor/Professor). The selection committee

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shall award the final marks to all the candidates appeared for interview in the proforma **Annexure A24** (F1,F2,F3).

The minimum percentage of marks (including interview score) for the suitability of selection of candidates for each discipline shall be decided by the University. However, in any case, it will not be less than 50%.

The above agenda of Screening Criteria for recruitment to the post of Assistant Professor, Associate Professor & Professor is placed before Academic Council for consideration.
