#### Minutes

Agenda Item 1: Dr. Anurag Kumar, Head of the School of Languages and Literature and Chairperson of the Board of Studies, warmly welcomed all the members to the 14th Board of Studies meeting. He outlined the agenda, emphasizing the discussion and approval of the course structure for the Four Year Undergraduate program, slated for implementation from 2024 onwards.

Dr. Kumar briefed the members on the syllabi of the FYUG program. The committee members examined the structure and engaged in constructive discussions, offering valuable suggestions for enhancement. Dean FOHSS, Dr. A.K. Das, meticulously reviewed the structure, rectifying certain categorizations of subjects, particularly those pertaining to Discipline Specific Electives.

Prof. Nagendra Kumar advocated for the inclusion of more Victorian literature in the 3rd semester course, 'British Literature: 18th to 19th Century'. Additionally, he proposed relocating the course titled 'Literary Genres' from the 5th to the 1st semester. Prof. Anupama Vohra

recommended the incorporation of Begum Rokeya's Sultana's Dream into the 'Women's Writing' course after a thorough examination of the detailed syllabi.

Prof. R.P. Singh proposed modifications to the course titled 'Indian Poetics', emphasizing the addition of introductory units covering Indian poetics, aesthetics, and major classical texts. He proposed that this approach would offer students a more comprehensive understanding of the subject matter.

Prof. Monika Sharma raised concerns regarding the credit distribution in the 5th semester, highlighting the need for additional 2-credit courses, as identified by external feedback. All suggestions and inputs from the committee members were duly considered and incorporated into the finalized structure.
